Directions for George Washington Rules of Civility Project

1. First, read all 110 of the Rules of Civility.
2. Select 10 that you like the best.
3. Of those ten, chose five that you think encourage character building.
4. With a partner, write a dialogue in George Washington's way of speaking on one side of a sheet of paper. On the other side, find and write a match for this rule in the MMS student handbook or write the rule in today's language.
5. The focus of your presentation is to *interview* George Washington and ask him to share with the class why the rules that you chose are important. One of you must be the interviewer and one of you must play the role of George Washington.

7. Remember to write your presentation in a dialogue format so that you can perform a short skit in front of the class.
